The organization's free programs educate residents about environmentally safe, effective and sustainable horticultural practices that build healthy landscapes. Programs include a "Hotline" consultation by phone (**301-590-9650**) or email mgmont@umd.edu; clinics to identify gardeners' plant and tree problems; therapeutic horticulture; demonstration gardens; speakers bureau; and design services for government and non-profit organizations. An intensive 75-hour training program in February is available for those who want to become Master Gardeners.
